Command, Action and Results - looking at the promises of God

Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and lean not on your own understanding; ⁶In all your ways acknowledge Him, and he shall direct your paths. (Proverbs 3:5-6 NKJV)

So often it is easy for us to miss the promises of God in His Word, even in some of the most memorable verses, like Proverbs 3:5-6. These verses are so recognisable by many today but, without truly understanding, it is so easy to miss the blessed promise God has for us, in these verses and throughout scripture. Whether it's because we aren't looking for them specifically or we focus our minds elsewhere.

As Christians we often over complicate things and forget that a childlike faith is all we need to draw closer to God. A simple way to look at verses and for God's promise is to break it down into: Commands, actions and result. In the example of Proverbs 3:5-6 they are:

Command: 'Trust in the Lord' & 'with all your heart'

Action: 'Do not lean on your own understanding' & 'In all your ways acknowledge Him'

Result: 'he shall direct your paths.'

We can see that without recognising the commands and actions given in this verse we cannot reap the blessing of our Saviour, in this case, allowing God to 'direct your paths.'

It is a simple method to use but one which hopefully will allow us to unlock many blessings and promises. Have a look at: Joshua 1:9, Philipians 4:6-7, or Matthew 11:28-30.


